Education attainment	Literacy rate.Enrolment in primary, secondary and tertiary level.




• Score: 0 to 1, with 0 being the lowest inequality while 1 being the highest equality.

Education attainment	Increase in the number of child marriages, and teenage pregnancies. These factors play a role in the education attainment of girls.








