Introduction

- Kenya is a Bicameral Legislature (NA, Senate)
- Legislature exercises sovereign Power inline with Article 3(a)
- The Mandate of Parliament is spelt out under 94
- Functions of MNA is set out in Article 95 and Senators in Article 96

Legislature

- Clause 12: Amends Article 96(3) that will extend the mandate of the senate to have oversight over county Own Source Revenue, borrowings, and expenditures.
 - Expands the Mandate of the Senate
- Clause 13: Amends Article 97, Changes Composition of NA, with base number of 366 and subsequent nominations to comply with 27 (8) of CoK, 2010
 - Nominations for Special Seats -Consideration given to Candidates who already vied, (Precedence to those with more votes)
 - Nomination of 2 Youths (1 man, 1 woman)
 - 4 members rep PWD's (2 men, 2 women)
 - Clause 12 allows for Ex Officio Members to sit in NA, including Leader of Opposition, AG, Cabinet Ministers (who are not MP's)
 - Special Seats- Sunset clause of the next three general elections (15 years)
- Clause 14: Amends Article 98, Changes Composition of the Senate to 1 man, 1 woman per county (Total=94)
 - Aims to achieve gender parity within the senate through representation by election of a man and a woman from each county to the house.
 - Expands the size of the Senate by 40%

Legislature.....Cont

- Clause 15: Amends Article 99(2) (a) & (d): Deletion of disqualification from vying for the seat of an MP on the basis of being an MCA
 - Removes the barrier on MCA's vying as Members of Parliament

- Clause 16: Adds Article 107A; the Leader of Official Opposition who:
 - Shall be the Person with second greatest number of Votes in a President election
 - The Leader of Official Opposition will have at least 25% of all Members of National Assembly
 - The Leader of Official Opposition and the PM cannot come from the same party or coalition of Parties

• Clause 17: Repeals Article 108: Changes Order of Precedence in NA, to recognize PM & Leader of Official Opposition (Speaker>PM>Leader of Official Opposition)

Legislature.....Cont.

- Clause 18: Adds 108A immediately after 108 which recognizes Senate Leadership and lists order of Precedence in the Senate
- Clause 19: Ammends Article 113(3): Lengthens the period of Originating House refering the Bill (Under Article 113, Bills Refered to Mediation Committe) to the President from 7 to 14 days
- Clause 20: Ammends Article 115(4)(b): Removes voting through delegations in the Senate
- Clause 21: Article 123 is repealed, Abolishes delegations in Senate

Conclusions

Removes the Separation of Powers between Executive and Parliament

The Ammendments expands the size of the Parliament

Would the ammendments lead to efficiency of Parliament in discharging its mandate?
